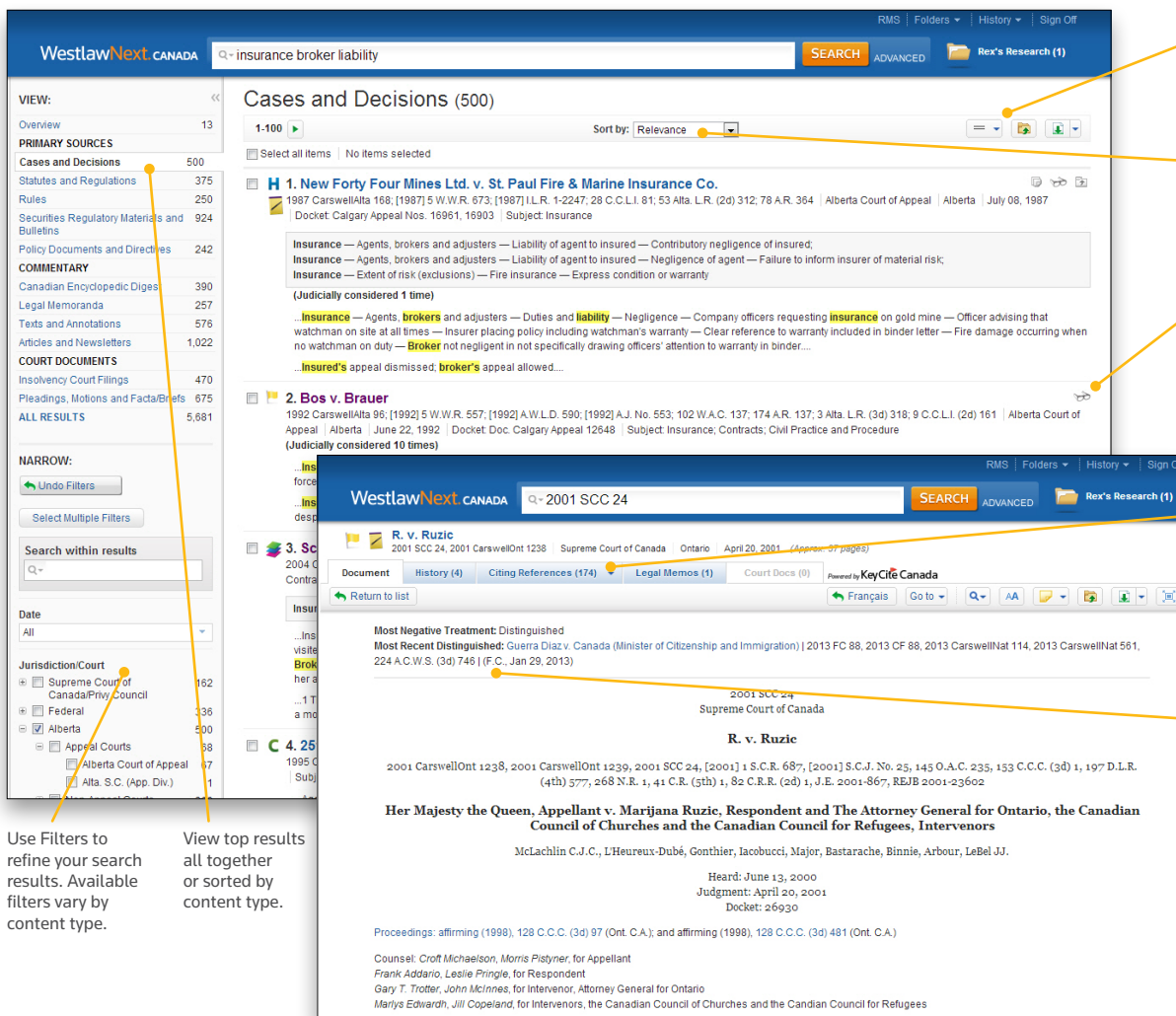

KeyCite Flags

- A yellow flag warns that the case has some negative history, but hasn't been reversed or overruled.
